Common Name: Dogwood Spittlebug

**Scientific Name:** Clastoptera proteus

Order and Family: Hemiptera: Clastopteridae

Type of feeder (Chewing, sucking, etc.): Sucking

**Host plant/s:** Dogwoods, Blueberries, and Buckeyes in the Midwest and Gambel Oaks in the Rocky Mountain Region

**Description of Damage (larvae and adults):** The dogwood spittlebug nymphs and adults cause little damage to trees; however, they do feed on the sap from dogwood trees.

The damage is usually unattractive, foam-like spittle masses formed by nymphs that are located in the junctions between stems or between stems and leaves.

The damage caused by adults is the unsightly occurrence of blackened foliage produced by sooty molds colonizing on the spittle that is flicked onto the leaves from the adults.

In severe infestations there may be stunted tree growth, malformed development of plant tissue, darkened foliage, branch dieback, or fungi and bacterial diseases.
