Type of feeder: Piercing/sucking

Host plant: Alfalfa

Description of Damage (larvae and adults): Ground mealybugs feed on alfalfa roots by sucking out plant juices, which causes stunting and yellowing of plants. The infestations generally start in small circular areas near the field borders and gradually increase in size up to an acre or so.
